Temporary Skills Shortage (482 Visa)

Ideal for healthcare professionals seeking employment opportunities in Australia, the 482 Visa is popular among those looking to gain international work experience without a long-term commitment. It requires sponsorship from an Australian employer and is a great fit for individuals with specific skills that are in high demand in Australia's healthcare sector. This visa offers the flexibility to live and work in Australia for up to four years, with the possibility of renewal.

Pro's & Con's of the Temporary Skills Shortage (482 Visa)



Employer-Backed Journey: The 482 visa facilitates sponsorship by healthcare employers, with the potential for them to cover associated costs, making the process financially accessible.



Swift Entry: Healthcare professionals can quickly join the Australian workforce, thanks to the 482 visa's faster processing times, allowing for a prompt start to their careers.



Path to Permanency: While initially temporary, the 482 visa serves as a stepping stone to permanent residency through the Temporary Residence Transition stream or the Employer Nomination Scheme. It is common for employers to also offer fast tracked pathways to Permanent Residency.



Temporary Nature: Professionals should be aware that the 482 visa is temporary, requiring renewal or transition to another visa for extended stays beyond the initial period of up to four years.

Visa options available

Employer Nomination Scheme (186 Visa)

The 186 Visa is designed for healthcare professionals who are offered a permanent position by an Australian employer. It's particularly suitable for those looking to settle in Australia long-term and offers a pathway to permanent residency. This visa is popular among individuals who have already established their careers and seek stability and a permanent role in the Australian healthcare system.

Pro's & Con's of the Employer Nomination Scheme (186 Visa)

- ✓ Permanent Residency: The 186 visa offers permanent residency, providing healthcare professionals with stability and a permanent place in the Australian healthcare system
- ✗ Extended Processing Time: Healthcare professionals considering the 186 visa should anticipate a longer processing time, requiring thorough planning for a permanent move to Australia. In 2023 the average processing time is around 6 months from submission.
- ✗ Personal Financial Commitment: Unlike the 482 visa where employers often cover costs, healthcare professionals may need to personally bear the expenses associated with the 186 visa application

Visa options available

Skilled Independent (189 Visa)

This visa is best suited for highly skilled healthcare professionals who do not require sponsorship from an employer or family member. The 189 Visa is a points-tested visa, making it popular among those who have strong qualifications and work experience but lack employer connections in Australia. It offers the flexibility of independent job search and is a direct route to permanent residency, appealing to those seeking long-term career development in Australia.

Skilled Nominated (190 Visa)

The 190 Visa is tailored for skilled workers who are nominated by an Australian state or territory. It's a perfect match for healthcare professionals who wish to live and work in a specific region of Australia and have the skills that align with that region's specific needs. This visa is popular for its potential for faster processing times and for offering a pathway to permanent residency for those committed to contributing to the local healthcare sector.

- ✓ Allows healthcare professionals nominated by an Australian state or territory to obtain permanent residency.
- ✗ Requires a nomination from a state or territory government.

Choosing Your Professional Path in Australia

When considering a move to Australia, we encourage everyone to weigh the pros and cons of different visas. While the 482 and 186 visas are prominent choices, exploring alternatives such as the Skilled Independent (189) or Skilled Nominated (190) visas may align better with individual preferences.



Market Insights

From the 100s of applications we receive monthly there are clear preferences for 186 visas due to receiving permanent residency upon arrival. However, there is a misconception that these visas are readily available across the country due to the volume of 186 visas offered during the COVID pandemic to prevent and resolve staff shortages across the country.

Now that Australia has recovered from the pandemic, 186 visas are becoming increasingly difficult to source, with them mainly being available in rural or sometimes regional locations. And it is also common for employers to expect the candidate to shoulder the costs involved with 186 visas, whereas 482 visas are often included within relocation packages.

We insist that every applicant explores each avenue available to them, as permanent residency is very obtainable in Australia when earned. In fact, most applicants can receive permanent residency within a 2 year window (or less when fast tracked), which is at least 3 years less than the UK offers.

Did you know...

Around 60% of our applications favor the 186 Visa for its immediate permanent residency in Australia. Post-pandemic, these visas are less available, mostly in rural areas, and often come with costs for the applicant. Conversely, the 482 Visa, usually covered in relocation packages, is gaining popularity. We advise exploring all visa types, as Australia often provides a path to residency within two years, faster than the UK's five-year average.



Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I travel to Australia for work?

Australia is renowned for its unspoiled natural beauty, including diverse ecosystems like golden sandy beaches, tropical rainforests, arid deserts, and snowy mountains, with over 500 national parks and 14 world heritage areas. As a multicultural society, 43% of Australians are either born overseas or have a parent who was, celebrating this diversity annually on Harmony Day (21 March). With the lowest population density of any continent, only 6.4 people per square mile, Australia offers a temperate climate with plenty of sunshine. Its healthcare system is among the world's most efficient, with Medicare providing basic health cover alongside a private healthcare system. The strong economy and low unemployment rate (around 5%) reflect the country's excellent job opportunities and commitment to a work-life balance. Australians are known for their laid-back, friendly lifestyle in cities with comparatively low crime rates.

482 to 186. The employer will cover the costs for a 482 for you & your family. The when transitioning to a 186 visa they will cover your cost and you will be required to pay for the supplement cost for your family members.

What is AHPRA?

To begin your journey into a healthcare career in Australia you will need to obtain registration with the Australian Health Professional Regulation Authority (AHPRA). Working Holiday Visa: Up to 31 years old
Permanent Residency (PR): Up to 45 years old
